E.g. Professional Qualifications * What do students want to study at the end of Year 11? What do they need to do to get there?
	4	Mon 23/09/2019	Qualification Levels	Students to understand the different qualification levels	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> * Card Sort/Organising activity for students to understand the difference between Level 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 qualifications * Students to organise cards to find out the equivalent qualifications to the stereotypical e.g. apprenticeship * Team leaders can reveal the answers on the board * Students could stick this to a larger sheet of paper to make a poster if they wish
		Fri 27/09/2019	Destination Roadmaps	To understand the routes for progression and the steps required to achieve this	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> * Students may want to work in groups and be assigned a 'Destination' for this activity * Students should create a roadmap/flowchart to show the pathways into University/Apprenticeships/Employment * Students should consider what they need to do/what needs to be achieved at each stage along the way * Example: 5x grade 5-9 at GCSE inc Eng & Maths, Level 3 BTEC or ALevels, University * Can be produced by hand or on the computer, should go into their PPD folder * Students may need to use the internet to help them research

	6	Mon 07/10/2019 Fri 11/10/2019	Labour Market Information Research	To know about the local needs in the careers sector	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> * Students to choose a sector that they wish to look at e.g. Aerospace Engineering (Individual or pairs) * Use the National Careers Service website to research information about that sector * https://nationalcareers.service.gov.uk/ * https://www.careerpilot.org.uk/ * Students should create a poster, by hand or on the computer * They should include what the job entails, the average salary, the typical hours, how to get the job * Students may want to include pictures, stats about that job, what the needs are in the local area

	7	Mon 14/10/2019	21st Century Skills	Students to explore the 'soft' skills required for 21st Century careers	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> * Use the Barclays Life Skills 21st Century Skills PPT/Worksheet * Play the game 'Skills Knockout' as a quick - fire activity (Team Leaders may want to consider a prize) * This activity will help students understand the number of and variety of different jobs that these skills are needed * If students repeat a job name then they're considered 'out' - You could consider a restart with each skill.
