It provides customer-relationship management services and also sells a complementary suite of enterprise applications focused on customer service, marketing automation, analytics, and application development. ## University of Reading – Virtual Courses

Teachers, parents and students may be looking for free, online resources to prepare for learning at home. In response, the University of Reading has made available more of our free, online courses over the coming months. Developed by expert staff in world-class departments, all courses are available on the online platform, FutureLearn, and include articles, videos, audio and quizzes. Social learning is at the heart of the courses and as well as being able to share new ideas, experiences and perspectives with other participants, course participants will be supported by university staff and students who contribute feedback and guidance throughout course discussions. Courses cover a diverse range of topics from Ancient Rome, to Robotics and Mental Health and the below are just some of the courses which may be useful to everyone but especially, A level students:

- **Unseen Poetry and the Creative Process:** Improve your skills in critical analysis and creative writing and discuss how texts can be interpreted by different readers.
- **Heart Health: A Beginner's Guide to Cardiovascular Disease:** Understand the structure and function of the cardiovascular system.
- **Small and Mighty: Introduction to Microbiology:** Recognise the differences between the five major groups of microbes and how they replicate, grow and exchange genes with each other.
- **A Beginner's and Intermediate Guide to Writing in English for University Study:** Learn the fundamentals of essay structure and get an introduction to research tools, writing critically, referencing, proofreading and avoiding plagiarism.
- **Live Smart: Your essential guide to living at University**
- **A parents and supporters' guide to University applications**
