Work Experience

It may seem a bit early to be thinking about work experience for summer 2022, but there are lots of different programmes out there that work to different timings, some in October half term, some in the spring and some with very early deadlines, so it pays to be prepared! We shall post opportunities we come across here, but if there are specific companies that you are interested in working for, it is worth getting in touch with them directly in order to find a great placement.

Government advice on Work Experience placements: Work experience is time spent in a workplace learning about a job role, a company or a career sector. Most work experience is unpaid though there are some types of opportunities where you can earn money. Companies are starting to develop 'virtual' placements, where you work remotely using digital technology, without having to go in to the workplace. To read more <u>click here</u>.

If you're already considering an alternative to university, this programme will help you build the skills you need for a head start on the EY Business Apprenticeship.
